#### Subject: CENTRAL NORTHALLERTON MASTERPLAN

Northallerton Wards Portfolio Holder for Support Service & Economic Development: Councillor Peter Wilkinson

## 1.0 **PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND:**

- 1.1 To inform Members of the intention to engage consultancy input to develop an overall Masterplan for a series of sites in the centre of Northallerton and to gain approval for funding.
- 1.2 The adjacent sites occupied by the Rural Payments Agency and Northallerton Prison are to be vacated following announcements of their closure. Neighbouring these is the Northallerton Fire Station. The Fire and Rescue Service is reviewing its estate and this site could become available for consideration as a comprehensive development package.
- 1.3 In addition Members should consider the inclusion of the Council's Crosby Road car park as part of the package of sites.
- 1.4 A Masterplanning exercise will ensure that uses for the sites are brought forward in a coordinated fashion, rather than developed piecemeal. This will ensure that they provide maximum benefit to the town and its economy, for a site that is strategically important to the County Town.
- 1.5 Masterplanning work will be informed by the emerging findings of the Economic Study that is currently underway. Officers are seeking to deliver the Masterplanning work so far as is possible alongside the Economic Study to produce the most appropriate outcomes that will assist the town's economy.
- 1.6 Members will be engaged early on and throughout the delivery of the project to ensure that their views and ideas are properly considered as part of the overall process.

## 2.0 LINK TO COUNCIL PRIORITIES:

2.1 The study will help deliver Council priorities by providing a robust evidence base from which to develop a Masterplan for development of these strategically important sites in the centre of the County Town. This will be used to inform planning decisions made on the sites providing supplementary planning considerations alongside the Local Development Framework policies.
