Subject: ALLOCATION OF SECTION 106 FUNDS

**Easingwold Ward**

### 1.0 PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND:

- 1.1 The Council's policy is to endorse Public Open Space, Sport and Recreation Action Plans to provide a more strategic and efficient process for allocating future Section 106 either from LDF allocations or windfall sites.
- 1.2 The Easingwold Action Plan was approved by Cabinet on 11 September 2012. Since the plan was approved two significant Section 106 contributions towards public open space, sport and recreation have been agreed as follows:-
  - York Road £79,132.70;
  - Ward Trailers £147,478.00.

There are also a number of Unilateral Undertakings in place for windfall sites in Easingwold totalling £18,088.00 to date, which will only increase over time.

- 1.3 The Council has previously granted planning permission for a site which includes a £650,000 contribution for a sports hall for Easingwold Secondary School. The School continues to fundraise towards the sports hall, but the lack of availability of other funding sources and the financial gap of over £1m means the delivery of the sports all could be some years away. The new Headteacher, supported by the School's Governing Body, has reprioritised and wishes to deliver a full size synthetic turf floodlit pitch at a cost of approximately £600,000. Funding applications to Sport England, the Football Foundation and the MoD Community Covenant Fund have been made and the School has requested that this Council agrees to release £100,000 of the £650,000 sports hall \$106 funding for this new purpose. This new facility will be managed joint by the School and the community.
- 1.4 The purpose of this report is to:-
  - 1) agree a schedule (detailed at Annex A) of how these funds are matched to projects in the Easingwold Action Plan so that they will be timely and appropriate to maximise the effectiveness and use of the funds; and
  - 2) agree this approach for other towns where significant S106 allocations are agreed.
- 1.6 The funding schedule has taken into account the following:-
  - Community need and impact the project will have in meeting this;
  - Strategic fit;
  - Project readiness;

- Match funding timescales;
- Value for money.
- 1.7 A copy of the Action Plan is available at Annex B.

# 2.0 LINK TO COUNCIL PRIORITIES:

2.1 This links primarily to the Health priority of the Council.

# 3.0 **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**:

3.1 The main method of delivery of S106 allocations is to passport external funding from developers to community groups. Funds will not be committed or released to organisations until the Council has received the monies from the developer.

### 4.0 **LEGAL IMPLICATIONS**:

4.1 There is a legal responsibility upon the Council to ensure this funding is used in a way consistent with the individual S106 Agreements.

## 5.0 RISK ASSESSMENT:

5.1 There are no significant risks to the Council.

# 6.0 SECTION 17 CRIME AND DISORDER ACT 1998:

6.1 Some of these projects have the potential to reduce crime and disorder through providing diversionary activity for young people.

7.1 All projects in receipt of this funding should have equal access and be available for the general public to use.

### 8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 8.1 It is recommended that:-
  - 1) the Section 106 funding schedule at Annex A is agreed:
  - 2) this approach is replicated for other towns where significant S106 allocations are agreed; and
  - 3) the Council agrees to release £100,000 of the Easingwold School Sports Hall funding to the new full size floodlit pitch.
